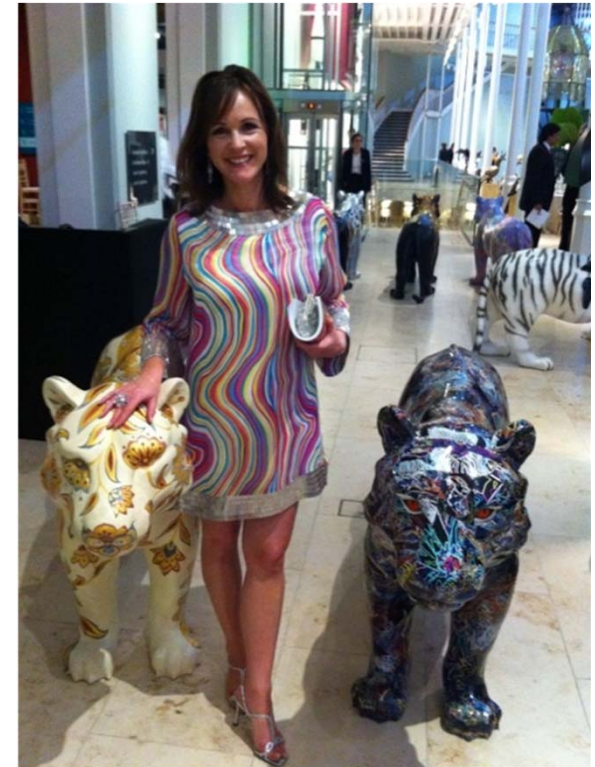

Jungle City Auction raises £400,000, and AAG takes home a tiger

Jack Vettriano's sculpture of a white Siberian tiger being ridden by his infamous singing butler titled 'The Singing Butler Rides Again and Again' was sold for £60,000 at last night's Jungle City auction. The sculpture was one of 31 auctioned at the event which was held at the National Museum of Scotland and raised a total of almost £400,000 for the Elephant Family charity.

Mark Shand (right), founder of Elephant Family, the charity behind the Jungle City exhibition, said: "It's been an honour to launch the first Jungle City Exhibition in Edinburgh and it's been so encouraging to see how Scotland has really got behind what we're trying to do to save these iconic animals from extinction."

"Last night exceeded all expectations and the bidding has already started to warm up online – so we're well on our way to raising £1 million for our projects across Asia to save the jungle homes for these animals before it is too late".
